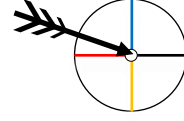


Hoop and Arrow



How to Play

1. At the start line, a thrower will assemble the hoops to be thrown down the course.
2. Participants line up along the length and toward the end of the course where the hoops will roll.
3. Each player will be given arrows or sticks to throw at the hoops.
4. Determine a points system for the hoops chosen to play with (ie. Decorated beads).
5. As the thrower throws the hoop down to roll along the course, the players throw sticks or arrows to the rolling target (hoop)
6. The player who hits the hoop with the most points wins.

What They Learn

1. Blackfoot culture: engaging with traditional ways of learning skills.
2. Working Memory: to develop accurate hand-eye coordination to hit a moving target.
3. Inhibition: by attending and calculating an appropriate time to throw the arrow or stick.
4. Emotional Control: by accepting and correcting mistakes and/or losses of the game with respect.



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
